About the Orleans Community Health Foundation

The Orleans Community Health Foundation was originally established in 1981 by a group of community members who sought to support Medina Memorial Hospital. Today, the foundation's mission is to raise funds to support the quality health care services provided by Orleans Community Health and the communities it serves.

In April 2020, Apex granted \$4,000 to the foundation to secure critical equipment to protect frontline health care workers during the earliest stages of the COVID-19 pandemic. With resources stretched thin and facing



challenges in procuring PPE, the foundation sought to purchase rapid sterilization equipment that would safely extend the life of N95 masks and other protective gear.

Prior to securing the new tabletop autoclave sterilization unit, the sterilization process could take up to several hours. As a result of Apex's donation, this time was reduced to 20 minutes–not only helping with the immediate PPE shortage, but also providing a lifelong time savings going forward.
